### Sailing in luxury

"De 4 Vaargetijden" is a barge elegantly finished in wood and copper, its proud owners offering their guests comfort and warm hospitality.

#### Lower deck:

Four cabins, each with two roomy beds, cupboard and private facilities: a shower, toilet and washstand. Every cabins is fitted with quilts, sheets and towels, hot/cold water, 220 V plug and central heating. A casement window provides for the necessary fresh air.

The big central salon is the culinary hub of "De 4 Vaargetijden". In the mornings a gorgeous breakfast awaits you and at noon and in the evening you can enjoy unique Flemish cuisine. Pleasantly relaxing, enjoying a board game or watching a film is all possible in this cosy place. A broad stairway connects the living room with the panoramic wheelhouse on the upper deck. The wheelhouse is an attraction in itself, while the sundeck makes it possible to sojourn pleasantly outside.



















## Our culinary delights will make your mouth water . . .

You can choose between full and half board. In both cases the extensive breakfast as well as the lunch buffet at noon are included. Generally the barge is underway at this time, so you can enjoy the passing scenery while you take another helping of the lunch buffet!

In choosing full board you will be able to sample Olga's delicious cuisine in the evening and linger at the dinner table on deck by candle light, with a Belgian beer! Your first meal aboard is the diner on the day of arrival.

Choosing half board, you are free to enter the harbour town each evening and discover for yourself the gastronomic fare that is available. Your ship's hosts can give plenty of advice! Your first meal aboard will be breakfast, day after arrival.

We are glad to support if possible any simple dietary wishes or special preferences. We request that you provide required information to our cook at least two weeks before departure.

## Short description of the meals:

Breakfast: different types of bread, muesli and cornflakes, milk ca 8.30 and yoghurt, cheese, ham, marmalade, egg, coffee, tea and juices.

10.00 hours: coffee or tea with Belgian cookies.

Lunch: different types of bread, sweet rolls, different toppings ca 12.30 for bread, some daily special like a salad / a quiche / some fish or a soup, coffee, tea, milk, mineral water and juices

Afternoon tea: coffee or tea with Belgian cookies.

By fullboard also:

Dinner: starter or soup, meat / fish, potatoes / pasta / rice, ca 19.30 2x vegetables, salad, a dessert, refreshment (water, wine, beer or lemonade)

## Choose your own barging formula ...

You can charter the full barge or enjoy an individual tour where you will sail in the company of others and have the opportunity to make new friends!

#### You can choose between:

Weekend: starts Friday 7 PM, ends Sunday 9 PM Midweek: starts Monday 7 PM, ends Friday 10 AM week: starts Friday 7 PM, ends Friday 10 AM An 10 or 15 days trip

#### Sailing ports:

Summer season: from April to September we sail from Oudenaarde or Maasmechelen (24/05/2010-18/06/2010)

Winter season: during the romantic winter months Bed & Breakfast is possible in Oudenaarde

#### Chartering the whole boat

- \* Routes: A group chartering the whole boat can choose one of the given routes or get a tailor made tour. Depending on the participants' wishes, the trip can offer opportunities to walk, to make cycling tours, go swimming or fishing. The itinerary could get close to museums, breweries, windmills, artistic events, markets or any other special target you have in mind. Of course barging is always included. The final selection of route and overnight stops is completely up to the group, in cooperation with the skipper. Even last minute changes during the trip are possible. Not all members of a group are forced to participate to all activities together. Some might go on a cycle tour, while others spend their time fishing or sunbathing on board. All members of the group can join at lunch or dinnertime.
- \* Schedule: Our ship can be chartered throughout the year.
- \* Harbour of departure:

Maasmechelen (24/05/2010-18/06/2010)

\* Meals: The boat can be chartered for up to eight people. It is your choice whether that includes full board or half board. Combination of these two within one group is not possible. Catering: starts around 20.00 (FB) on the first night on board with the welcome dinner, and stops after breakfast around 10.00 on the day of disembarkation, or after dinner on Sunday (FB) around 21.00 for the weekends.

#### Routes and schedules open for individual participants:

\* Routes: All routes described in the schedule below can be booked by cabin. Our planning is based on the situation in November 2009. It is possible that we have to change these routes during the year 2010. Always check with us to see if there are any changes in these routes.

\* Meals: Catering starts around 20.00 on the first night on board with the welcome dinner (FB), and stops after breakfast around 10.00 on the day of disembarkation, or after diner on Sunday (FB) around 21.00 for the weekends.



# Barge and bike, paradise on the water . . .

Combine barging with bicycle activity for a really unforgettable vacation! We offer special routes to please the active bikers.

Combining barging with bicycling is possible on all our tours.

Unpacking is required only once; the barge "De 4 Vaargetijden" will join you at the next stop every day and offer you all facilities!

Available on board are over hundred bicycle tour maps and we have selected the most beautiful bicycle routes for you. Regular distances go from 38 to 69 km per day, although most bike routes offer alternatives.

Sometimes it is possible to join the barge in the morning, then go biking in the afternoon or complete the whole journey. No personal guide will bicycle with you, so some map reading skills are necessary!

Particularly in Wallonia, there are hardly any road signs, routes B & TD. Some map reading skills are surely required here. The hilly landscape demands some physical effort too.

The other routes are mostly flatlands, routes C & M, or slightly hilly, route I. The system of indicated cross points covers now whole Flanders. It will be hard to get lost!

The best place to view the picturesque river Old Leie is from the sundeck of "De 4 Vaargetijden". You won't like to miss this stretch. The routes A,M,C,E & H let you enjoy this beautiful river.

Bicycles with 6 speeds and some extra utilities are available for you. But if you prefer your own bike, feel free to bring it with you.
